Die Planungen für die **OLMUN** vom 21. – 24. Juni 2022 laufen bereits auf Hochtouren.

Sie soll 2022 auf jeden Fall stattfinden, auch wenn es die Corona Lage womöglich notwendig macht, Teile der Konferenz in den digitalen Raum zu verlegen.

Sofern irgendwie verantwortbar, sollen in diesem Jahr - ähnlich wie in 2021 - auch reale Begegnungen stattfinden, allerdings in kleineren Gruppen. Vor Corona sind sich in Oldenburg um die 800 Teilnehmer*innen aus aller Welt begegnet.

Der Anmeldeschluss in diesem Jahr ist der 01. April 2022.

Die Teilnahmegebühr beträgt **35,00 EUR** und umfasst sämtliche Materialien und Lizenzen, die für die Konferenz benötigt werden.

Die Konferenzsprache ist Englisch. Die Teilnahme an dieser internationalen Konferenz wird in einer Mittagsfreizeit vorbereitet. Hier erfahrt ihr genauer, was die United Nations genau machen und wie die Simulation der United Nation Versammlung ablaufen wird. Auch werdet ihr sprachlich fit gemacht, damit ihr eure Ideen auch angemessen formulieren könnt.

So, what is the Olmun all about?

We understand that a Model United Nations Conference might currently not have the highest priority at schools, but we are hoping that you will consider a participation. Not only will we – the

Secretariat and Inner Circle as organizers of OLMUN – be able to persevere and continue to host MUNs in the future but you will be giving your students the chance to experience extracurricular activities even under such circumstances.

The students will directly experience the work and procedures of the United Nations and thus enhance their understanding of international relations. Their voice as a diplomat of an assigned nation is required in nine different committees dealing with various topics. The practical experience of political processes encourages the students to deepen their knowledge and thus to shape their own future. Furthermore, participants will get the chance to improve their rhetorical abilities, self-confidence, debating as well as their language skills since the official language at OLMUN is English. In preparation for the conference, delegates do research on the policies of the country they represent and write draft resolutions and political statements on the issue. Those will be discussed in committees chaired by experienced MUN participants, who will also assist the delegates concerning all conference matters.

We hosted numerous socializing activities in the past. During those events, the students can learn about other cultures and get to know each other. This also contributes to OLMUN's special atmosphere and its unique sense of community, which is the reason why many delegates come back every year. We will try to realize some activities without harming any regulations or the health of our participants.

Every delegation shall be accompanied by a **MUN-Director**, who will be the contact person for the participants as well as for the organizing team. The teacher guides the delegates through the preparation process and supports them during their stay in Oldenburg.
